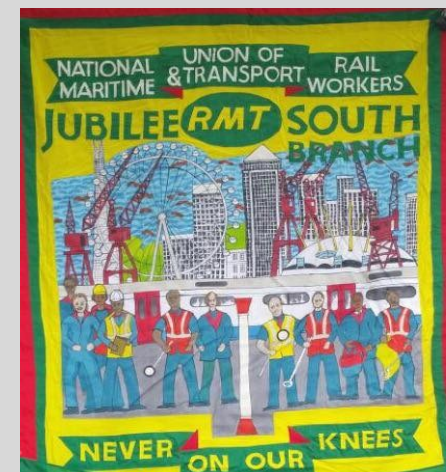

When do I need an RMT rep?



You are entitled to take a rep to any meetings with management whilst you are off sick, at LDIs and CDIs with adequate preparation time to be done on LUL time, at case conferences, grievances, fact finding interviews or any meeting where your future is being discussed.

If management say you don't need a rep then you should ask why they don't want one there.

Involve the union as soon as possible if there is an issue. Your local rep and RMT Jubilee South branch are here to help you.

Meetings where you should be accompanied by an RMT rep include:

- ✓ Local Disciplinary (LDI)
- ✓ Company Disciplinary (CDI)
- ✓ Sick Review
- ✓ Case Conference
- ✓ Fact Finding
- ✓ Probation review
- ✓ PTOA
- ✓ Flexible working request
- ✓ Any other meetings with bosses
- ✓ Formal or 'informal'; check first!

Which branch am I in? Jubilee South!

Members of the RMT are organised into branches based on the location they work. On London Transport there are several branches for London Underground, as well as a DLR branch, Taxi branch and branches for LUL Fleet and LUL Engineering workers.

You are a member of **Jubilee South branch** if you are in the RMT and work in the following locations:

- On stations from Stratford to Westminster
- At Stratford or North Greenwich train crews
- In the SMD control tower
- In the canteen at Stratford
- As a cleaner in any of the above locations

What is the branch for?

The branch is the cornerstone of the RMT and the interface between the individual member and the rest of the union, helping members to find their way through the union's structures and bureaucracy; providing assistance and advice and the opportunity to participate in the union at all levels.

That could mean, for example, debating the latest pay claim, getting reports on local issues from our reps, determining ways to assist a colleague in difficulty or considering wider political issues that are affecting our jobs or lives.

The branch may pass a motion on a subject. This is a written submission of the branches view or a request for

support or action which then gets sent to our region to debate or to our executive committee who will make a decision on how the union will act. A motion that you bring to branch, could become policy of the entire union.

RMT Jubilee South branch details



Jubilee South branch meetings are held each pay day at 1600 at the Blue Eyed Maid which is on Borough High Street. The nearest station is London Bridge.
