We are particularly proud of our relationship with the POA, RMT and the PCS who (along with the CWU, NUM, NUJ and countless union branches, trades councils and anti-cuts campaigns) officially support the NSSN and were so prominent in this historical debate that can give hope to millions of workers and working-class people in general, that this government's austerity offensive can be met with fierce resistance from the trade union movement. Before the start of Congress, the NSSN organised a lobby of the TUC, which saw up to a thousand union members march through Brighton in support of the POA motion.

We now firmly believe that this vote can change the character of the TUC's October 20th demonstrations in London, Glasgow and Belfast. Along with the rest of the union movement, the NSSN will strive to help build a turnout that even eclipses the massive demonstration on March 26th 2011.
