# **BEWARE THE £5 MINIMUM TOP UP**

The £5 minimum top up on the Oyster Card is a Trojan horse: This change to working practices is designed specifically to force more and more passengers to use the web and corner shops when they want to top up their Oyster Cards.

This policy is a back door to pulling down the blinds on booking offices permanently. This Union has not been consulted on the implementation of the £5 minimum top up at Ticket offices. We believe this policy is both an attack on customers, especially poorer people, and a threat to the future of ticket offices and jobs.

### **Bank/Monument Update**

Staff on Bank group oppose the coma work location where they do not want to work, and replace them with people who are not nearly as familiar with the station. Bank/Monument complex is the largest underground railway station in Europe. There are already serious concerns about staffing levels, assaults and evacuation times on the station, and replacing staff who are familiar with the running of the station and well versed in evacuation procedures can only make these problems worse. After 120 staff signed a petition against this, and RMT representatives put our case forcefully to management, we are now hopeful that no-one will have to move who does not want to. However, we can never be confident in management to protect our rights, so keep yourself up to date with the situation by talking to your reps and getting active in your union. .
